What is Different about Completing a Degree Abroad?

In the United States, most veterinary schools award their graduates a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) degree. Some other countries expedite higher education so that students enter a graduate level program directly after high school. These programs are considered comparable in rigor and curriculum to a graduate program in the United States. Thus, a Bachelor of Veterinary Science from an AVMA accredited university abroad has the same value as a DVM degree.

Some examples of veterinary medical degrees awarded abroad are: The Bachelor of Veterinary Science (BVSc or BVSC), Bachelor of Veterinary Medicine (BVetMed), or Bachelor of Veterinary Medicine and Surgery (BVM&S or BVMS).

One factor to consider when applying to programs offering this type of degree is average age of participants. Because most students will be entering veterinary school directly from high school, you may have peers who are much younger than yourself. However, this does not detract from the program in any way.

Once you have completed your studies...

To practice as a veterinarian in the United States, you must have either:

- 1) Graduated from an AVMA Council on Education (COE)-accredited school (All of the universities listed on this document meet this requirement).
- 2) Completed an educational equivalency certification program such as that administered by the AVMA's Educational Commission for Foreign Veterinary Graduates (ECFVG).

Upon fulfilling one of these requirements, you will need to complete all state veterinary licensure requirements. This includes passing the national licensure examination administered through the National Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners, as well as any state-specific examinations.
